As we prepare for the much-anticipated second annual Ma'mo'weh Wii'soo'ka'tiwin Foundation Gala at the historic Fairmont Royal York, we are once again reminded of the profound role this gathering plays in advancing healing and growth for youth and families.

The Ma'mo'weh Wii'soo'ka'tiwin Foundation (www.mwffoundation.ca) was established in response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada's Calls to Action. The Foundation is grounded in uniting efforts to support and encourage empowerment and reconciliation through pathways of hope and healing for Indigenous youth and families. It is a call to action – and an opportunity – for us all to be part of lasting, meaningful changes.

At the heart of the Foundation's work is the Makate Waagamichiwanang Gakinaa'amaatiwin Youth and Family Wellness Camp. More than just a camp, this off-reserve healing space provides culturally rooted programs that support at risk youth facing mental health challenges and trauma. Each month, over 400 individuals access programming that includes equine therapy, land-based teaching, summer camps, and recreational activities. The camp has become a beacon of support for those who need it most.

However, the need for funding remains ongoing. Due to its off-reserve location, the camp is not eligible for many traditional government funding. This is where your partnership becomes critical.

By sponsoring the Gala, you are not just supporting an event – you are directly investing in the lives of Indigenous youth and their families. You are helping to sustain a space where healing is possible, where cultural identity is celebrated, and where a new generation can thrive.

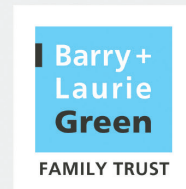
